

## EDITOR'S NOTES

We regret that due to incessant increases in production costs our prices for 1977 will be: single copies \$4.50; one-year individual subscriptions \$9.50, and institutional subscriptions \$12.00. The Canadian Comparative Literature Association's membership dues will be \$16.00 per annum. The *Review* has maintained its initial prices for three years, although the number of published pages has been increased by about a forme (16 pages) per issue. We hope that readers and subscribers will understand our position and continue their support.

The *Canadian Review of Comparative Literature/Revue Canadienne de Littérature Comparée* is inaugurating its series of books in Comparative Literature with the publication of the *Proceedings of the VIIIth Congress of the ICLA/AILC (Montréal-Ottawa, 1973)* and a study by E.J.H. Greene on *Menander to Marivaux: The History of a Comic Structure*.

The manuscript of the *Proceedings* comprises about 2500 typewritten pages, with contributions mainly in English and French by some 230 scholars, and is divided into two thematic volumes (Literatures of America: Dependence, Independence, Interdependence; Comparative Literature Today: Theory and Practice). The editors are Milan V. Dimić (general editor), Juan Ferraté, Eva Kushner (general organizer of the congress), and Roman Struc; the printer is the Publishing House of the Hungarian Academy of Sciences (Akadémiai Kiadó, Budapest), and distribution is assured by Kunst und Wissen Verlag, Stuttgart (and, perhaps, by Les Presses de l'Université du Québec, Montréal). The manuscript is with the Hungarian publisher; page proofs are expected within three months and publication in six months' time.

The study by E.J.H. Greene is published by the University of Alberta Press, Edmonton, while negotiations are underway between this press and Les Presses de l'Université du Québec in Montréal for a copublication of the whole series. Editorial control is in the hands of the *Review's* editorial bodies, and the series is sponsored by the Canadian Comparative Literature

Association/Association Canadienne de Littérature Comparée. Prices and other relevant information will be available in the near future.
